The 1862 Homestead Act

In 1862 President Abraham Lincoln signed into law the Homestead Act and opened up federal land for settlement. This law gave each head of household—men, women, minorities, or immigrants—a chance to own 160 acres for only the cost of the filing fee. Once the required improvements were made to the homestead, the claim could be patented. The homestead filings started on January 1, 1863. The final homestead claim was filed in Alaska in 1974. During the homestead era, settlers claimed over 270 million acres across the country. The statistics for Idaho are impressive:

Total: 60,221 homestead claims

Total acres in State: 52,960,640

Total acres homesteaded in State: 9,733,455

Total percentage of Idaho homesteaded: 18%


