### Day of the Dead Steamroller Printing Project

The Idaho State Historical Museum, Wingtip Press, BSU, and the Boise Department of Arts & History are partnering on a steamroller printing project for this year's Day of the Dead celebration. If you are an experienced printmaker or a novice who wants to try wood block printing on a large scale, this project is for you.

Participating artists will design, create, and print a large scale banner that will be hung at the Historical Museum or other Boise location during the October 29-Nov 9th Day of the Dead celebration. Participants will be required to provide their own piece of 4' x 8' mdf and carving tools, deliver their printing block to the Historical Museum on October 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup>, and provide at least two hours assistance at the steamroller printing party held behind the museum on Saturday, October 12<sup>th</sup>.
