


June 10th

“History of the National Old Time Fiddler’s Contest”

Leslie Beck will be sharing the history of the annual National Oldtime Fiddlers Contest, which is held in Weiser, Idaho. Fiddling in Weiser was reported as early as 1863. Through the years different fiddle contests were held in Weiser. In 1963, the present National Oldtime Fiddlers’ Contest was launched. In the same year, the Idaho Oldtime Fiddlers Organization was inaugurated in order to celebrated the state’s Territorial Centennial.

Leslie Beck is the granddaughter of Mannie Shaw, one of the founders of the Idaho Oldtime Fiddlers Organization. She was raised in the fiddling culture and will give a history of fiddling in Idaho.

Joining Leslie to demonstrate will be Katrina Nickolayeff.

She began fiddling as a toddler, a fiddle in one hand and a bottle in the other. Katrina has won Nationals five times as a Small Fry, a Jr. Jr., a Jr. She is a two time Grand Champion and two time World Champion in Nashville.

played at the old Airway Park, located on Walnut Street.

By 1952 the Boise franchise became affiliated with the New York Yankees and the ball park was renamed Joe Divine Field. The team was “The Boise Yankees”. In 1955 the team became affiliated with the Milwaukee Braves and then became “The Boise Braves.” At that time the park was renamed “Braves Field.” Today the Idaho Fish and Game building occupies

Bob (Bobby) King will tell you first hand about “baseball in Boise.” He played minor league baseball in Boise from 1950 through 1958 with the exception of the three years (1952-1954) he served in the Marine Corps.

When Bob started playing in Boise, the team was called “The Boise Pilots.” It was independently owned and operated by Haydn Walker. They

Bob’s knowledge of baseball has been acquired through playing 9 years in the minor leagues and scouting for the Houston Astros for the past 25 years.
