

## Great Training Opportunity for Social Studies Teachers

Teaching with Primary Sources (TPS) helps students develop a critical and comprehensive understanding of history. It enables teachers to create a relevant and meaningful learning experience for students.

The Idaho State Historical Society, in association with the Library of Congress TPS program, is offering a two and a half day workshop on TPS hosted at the Nez Perce National Historical Park, Spaulding. To be held June 10<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup>, 2015, presented in partnership with Amy Canfield, Lewis Clark State College and Dulce Kersting, Latah Historical Society.

Workshop is open to middle and high school teachers and school librarians.

Participants will receive:

- 20 hours of intensive classroom instruction on implementing TPS in the classroom
- Access to local historical experts and resources
- Ongoing mentoring from ISHS staff and master teachers
- Reimbursement for lodging and mileage
- Classroom materials
- Teacher In-Service credit available through Lewis Clark State College
- A \$125 bonus on completion of implementation of lesson plans developed during the workshop
