

## Idaho Day Map Drawing Contest—Senior Division (Gr.7-12)

It is best to use an 11x17 “map of Idaho with the county boundaries outlined. Your teacher should have an electronic copy of the map to print out. Click  for the map. To enter the contest, please submit your map to Todd Brown, Idaho Falls School District 91 Administration building, 690 John Adams Pkwy. by 5:00 p.m., January 30, 2015. Please include your name and phone number on the back of the entry. Contest entries may be displayed during the local Idaho Day Celebration event planned for March 4, 2015.

### Minimum Requirements for map

1. Write in the name of each county.
2. Name the county seat in each county and identify its location with a circled dot. Name the capital city and identify its location with a star.
3. Name the following towns and identify their location with a dot: Ashton, Aberdeen, Buhl, Coeur d’ Alene, Glenns Ferry, Grangeville, Idaho Falls, Kellogg, Ketchum, Lewiston, Mackay, McCall, Montpelier, Moscow, Nampa, Pocatello, Post Falls, Salmon, Sandpoint, Stanley, Twin Falls
4. In blue, draw and name the following rivers, lakes, and reservoirs: Priest Lake, Payette Lake, Palisades Reservoir, Lake Pend Oreille, Cascade Reservoir, Blackfoot Reservoir, Lake Coeur d’ Alene, American Falls Reservoir, Henry’s Lake, Dworshak Reservoir, Island Park Reservoir, Bear Lake, Snake River (include Henry’s Fork and South Fork), Boise River, Salmon River (all branches), Clearwater River (all branches), Bruneau River, Big Lost River, Bear River, Wood River, Owyhee River, Payette River, Lochse River, Coeur d’ Alene River, Priest River, St. Maries River, St. Joe River
5. Locate and name the following geographic places: Hells Canyon, Frank Church Wilderness Area, Coeur d’ Alene Mining District, Sawtooth National Recreation Area, Seven Devils, Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness Area, Thousand Springs, Mt. Borah, Shoshone Falls, Craters of the Moon, and Idaho’s Indian Reservations
6. Draw and label the following mountain ranges: White Cloud Mts., Salmon River Mts., Sawtooth Mts., Clearwater Mts., Lemhi Mts.
7. In red, locate and name the following historic locations: Route taken by Lewis and Clark (Corps of Discovery) (dotted line), Oregon Trail (solid line), Chief Joseph and the Nez Perce route (red-dash-dot line), Cataldo Mission, Franklin, site of first gold discovery, Silver City
8. Include a Map Key.
9. Please add additional items on the map if you would like.
10. It is suggested that you color your map and add a title and additional drawings related to Idaho. Think of this as a work of art.
