

Text of the Treaty of Fort Boise, October 10th, 1864

Number 91
September, 1965

Caleb Lyon of Lyonsdale Governor & Ex officio Superintendent of Indian Affairs - on behalf of the U.S.A. & we the chief and head-men of the Sho-Sho-nee Nation of Indians belonging to and occupying the Boise Valley Sol[e]mnly agree to this treaty of amity and eternal friend ship between them and the Government of the U.S.

1st That we release all right title & interest to all lands to thirty miles on each side, from the centre of the Boise river and to all the country drained by the tributaries of the Boise from its mouth to its Source - Except so much as the Government of the Us shall deem proper & set apart as a reservation or any other location that may be set apart for our use - with the right of Equally sharing the fisheries of said river with the citizens of the U S. Provided that the U. S. will made the same provision for our welfare that the U. S. have made with the most favored tribes with whom it has Indian treaties - that we agree to also deliver all horse thieves, murderers, & violaters of the laws of us up for trial -

Done at Boise City This tenth of October in the year 1864. In presence of Col. R. F. Maury - Commanding Fort Boise & Major Sewell Truax Commanding Fort Lapwaii
