Railroad construction in all parts of Idaho.

The most recent subscription history.

Bird, Annie Laurie. Boise, the Peace Valley. Caldwell, 1934.  
Includes the Boise Basin and Valley from discovery to the 1930's.

Bird, Annie Laurie. My Home Town. Nampa, 1968.  
A detailed history of Nampa.

Bischoff, William H. The Jesuits in Old Oregon. Caldwell, 1945.  
Includes chapters on North Idaho Indian missions.

## II. REMINISCENCES

Reminiscences must be used with great caution, but some, such as Thomas Donaldson, Idaho of Yesterday (Caldwell, 1941), and William A. Goulder, Reminiscences . . . . (Boise, 1909), contain interesting accounts of Idaho life and times in the early days.

## III. QUARTERLIES AND SERIAL WORKS

Four prominent regional historical quarterlies frequently contain articles on Idaho: Idaho Yesterdays, Pacific Northwest Quarterly, Oregon Historical Quarterly, and Montana: The Magazine of Western History. Other scholarly journals, such as the Pacific Historical Review, Journal of the West, and the Utah Historical Quarterly, also have Idaho articles. There are serial publications from other fields available, such as the Bulletins of the Idaho Bureau of Mines and Geology, which are useful. An example is Bulletin No. 18, Idaho's Mineral Industry . . ., which is designed primarily for high school students.
