- Clawson, Marion and Burnell Held. The Federal Lands: Their Use and Management. Baltimore, 1957. An examination of the changing concepts of public land management including land practices affecting Idaho.
- Coletta, Paolo E. William Jennings Bryan. Lincoln, 1964-Multivolume. Volume one covers the period when Bryan led the mid-west and western movement for free silver.
