Discovered in 1904 by Challis prospectors, this upper Warm Springs Creek district had an eight-foot vein of \$30 ore, with gold and silver assays as high as \$2,365 a ton. With fifty claims, this fairly small district, eventually drained by Loon Creek, generated considerable excitement for a year or more. After showing more initial promise than later production, Parker Mountain finally accounted for \$10,000 by 1915.
