DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Buhl City Hall is a two-story stucco building in Mission style. An outset center bay with a Baroque false gable dominates the facade. A simple entry porch marks the entry in this bay on the first floor. A pair of second story doors with a large round arch window frame leads to the porch roof-balcony. Circular windows flank the main window.

All first story openings, including the two fire house doors to the left rear are round arched. The fire house doors' arches are supported by terra cotta pilasters. An entry with a carriage porch similar to the portico in style dominates the right side.

The hipped roof is broken at the corners by curved battlements. Two asymmetrical chimneys break the roofline. The one at the southeast corner has an especially striking combination of baroque curves in relation to the corner detail to which it relates.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Buhl City Hall is architecturally significant as a good local example of the Mission style. This style was popular in the area of Twin Falls county between 1910 and 1928 and this building is the best example of the style used for governmental functions.

Buhl, founded in 1906, is important as a service center for the western part of the Twin Falls Carey Act irrigated tract in which F. W. Buhl, a prominent Pittsburgh capitalist, invested extensively to get the project underway. This city hall reflects the confidence of a prosperous farm community that had experienced more than a decade of expansion and prosperity.
