The Emmanuel Episcopal Church is a modest Gothic revival parish church rendered in brick. It is distinguished by its bell cope, which terminates with a celtic cross, and its steep gabled roof, so commonly employed on parish churches with bell copes. Although lacking buttresses the church maintains its Gothic character with its stained glass lancet windows and Gothic arched entry. The building stands on a raised foundation of local stone, as the site slopes away towards the rear.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Emmanuel Episcopal Church is architecturally significant for its unique design. Its bell cope, so common in early English Gothic parish churches, is rare in Idaho and greatly adds to the charm of this modest church.

This house of worship is one of the earliest brick churches in the state, built at a time when Hailey was the developing metropolis of the Wood River mining district.

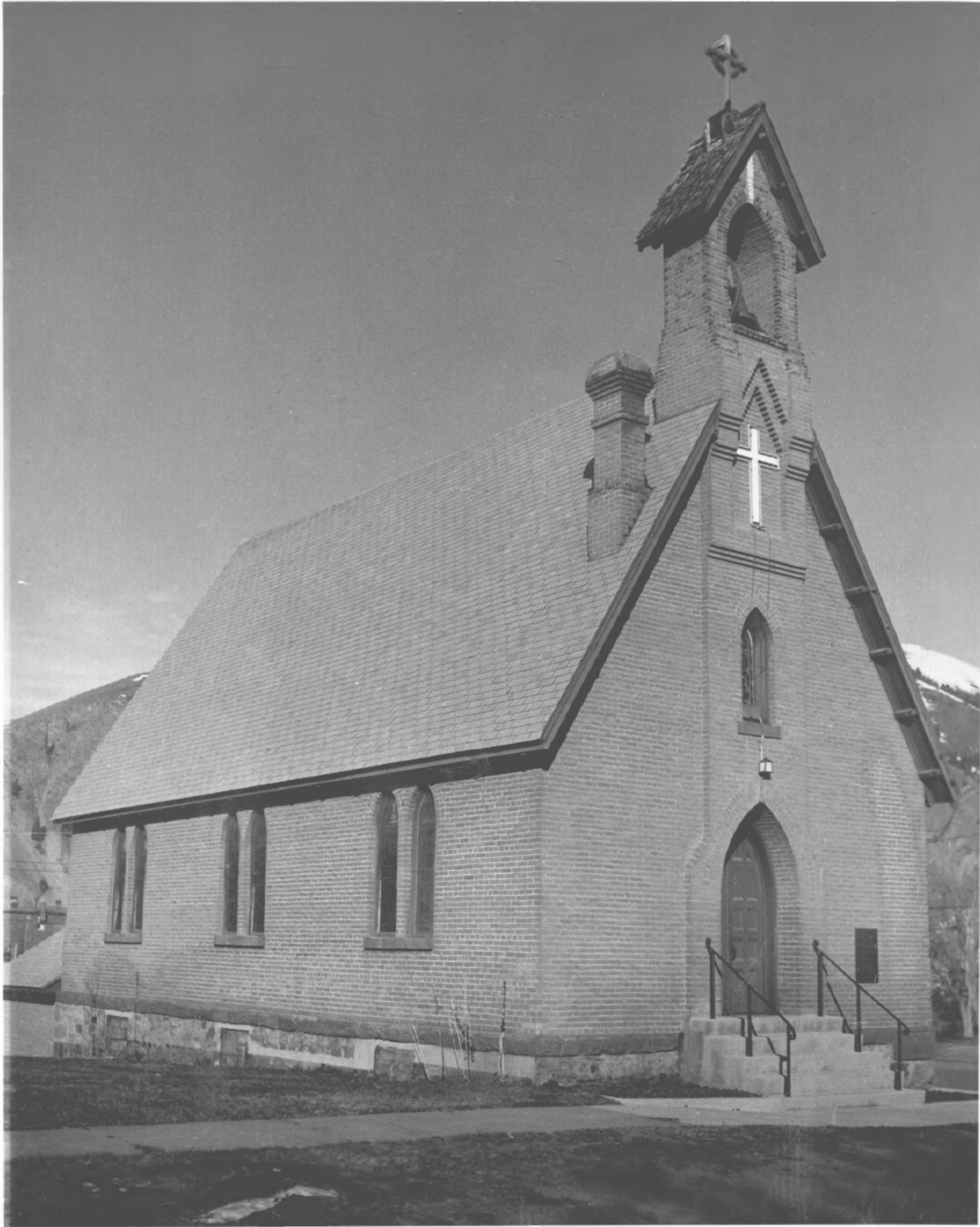
