### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The old commercial center of Lewiston, Idaho, at the west end of Main Street comprise a compact and historic district, worthy of special identification and preservation on the basis of the character of its late 19th and early 20th century buildings, and their historic importance. (Numbers below refer to map attached).

The youngest building in the district is also the largest. Designed by famed Spokane architect Kirtland K. Cutter, the Lewis-Clark Hotel (1) was opened in September, 1922. It is a five story U-shaped Mission style building with lower wings and arcades framing a garden court. Two square towers give variety to the skyline. Stucco, red-tile and round arched windows complete the Mission effect. The hotel is in excellent condition the only significant alteration being a change from tan paint to white on the exterior.

Continuing along Main street from the west, the first group on the right hand side of the street are the H. C. Kettenbach Building (2), 124-134 Main, built in 1907, the 1st Weisgerber Building (3), 200-204 Main, 1899, and the S. Wildenthaler Building (4), 206-210 Main, 1899. This group of two-story commercial structures have a unified Romanesque revival character, combining rusticated stone trim and pressed brick. Cast iron imported from St. Louis was used in the store fronts on the street level, and pressed tin was used in fabricating two bay windows on the second story of the Kettenbach Building.

In the next błock the Vollmer-Scott (5) and Goldstone Buildings (6) at 303-313 Main are also from the turn of the century, when this end of Main was turned from flimsy wooden construction into brick and stone. Both buildings have been used as annexes to the Bollinger Hotel across the street to the north, and the Goldstone Building has housed a series of barbershops in the same space since it was built.

The pair of buildings next on the right at 322-324, and 326 Main comprise one of the most interesting groupings in the district. The Donzac Block (7) has especially fine cast iron columns and pilasters, and a stamped tin cornice with urn finials. The building housed the Donzac saloon when it was completed, November 6, 1896, and a gun shop next door.

The Commercial Trust Building (8), locally known as the old marble bank, is notable for a classical facade in stone topped by a balustrade. The main entrance to the bank was a set of steps leading up to an elevated first floor, allowing a raised basement, with good light, reached by stairs going down. Three massive red granite columns on the first floor contrast with the light gray color of the rest of the building. Pilasters of the second story and finials in the balustrade carry these lines through to the skyline. Windows on the second story are spacious, framed in Palladian form. The building was completed in 1905 and housed banks until the dark days of 1933 when the last one closed.

Charles Francis Adams of Boston is represented in Lewiston by the first of this group of four structures, completed in September, 1899. 400-408 Main (9) is only one of a number of investment properties Adams held in Idaho, stemming no doubt from his rail-road interests in the area. After his term as Union Pacific president (1883-1890), he attempted to build a line down Snake river to Lewiston, and founded Clarkston across the river.

The Beach (10) and Beehive (11) buildings, 410-414 Main, were both incorporated into the department store business operated by R. C. Beach. The first was begun in 1894 and the second was in business by 1902. Their large neighbor on the corner, 444 Main, the other building in the district erected by Christ Weisgerber Block (12) is in the Italian

palazzo form with quoins and accented cornice. The effect is emphasized by having arched windows in the top floor.

The handsome Vollmer Block (13) was built in 1884 by one of North Idaho's most successful men. Hailed at the time as "the finest building this side of San Francisco," it served first as a general merchandise store and bank, and still continues as the latter. In an excellent state of repair, this two-story structure has the high, narrow look of the period, accentuated by brick pillasters that extend beyond the cornice to make square-topped finials. The main entrance is set at an angle in the southeast corner and now gives access to a bank with period decor. Ornate cast iron pilasters imported from an Eastern foundry are a feature of the south facade, and all openings are topped with segment-arched "eyebrows."

The Butler Building (14) also has notable cast iron in the store front on Main street, in this case brought from Spokane in 1899. A four story brick, this structure has the typical light and open look of cast iron and glass construction on the first two stories with heavier effect above. The brick cornice has a zig-zag motif, topped by a small false gable. The building is unaltered.

Facing D street are two other brick buildings of some interest. The Means Building (15) is a large two-story brick structure with corner doorway. Ground floor has several shops, most with large round-arched windows bordered with keystone motif. Most of the second-story windows are round-arched also. The decorative cornice has stepped dentils, which also adorn the second-story window sills. Flat roof line is broken by a few brick finials and an arched pediment over corner doorway. Basically unaltered.

The three-story Bollinger Hotel (16) presents a massive and blocky appearance that is typical of large commercial buildings of the period. Square lines are emphasized by vertical pilasters that intersect cornice, horizontal frieze between second and third floors, and dark band between first two floors. Third floor window are all double-hung sash; second floor windows alternate pairs of round-arched windows with double-hung sash; and most first floor windows and doors are topped with fan-shaped windows. Corner doorway is no longer used. Extensively added to and simplified by the removal of cornice detail, the Bollinger Hotel is about to begin restoration to recapture its original character.

The Luna House (17) takes its name from Lewiston's most famous hotel which stood nearby in goldrush days. The present structure is a curious example of vernacular architectural assemblage, notable for extravagant primitive deocrations on the interior. Basically a bungalow in its present form, this sole survivor of domestic building in the neighborhood is ascribed by local tradition to the 1860's, although it is so altered as to be unrecognizable. Stucco, gesso moldings, and a variety of other sculptural materials (including seashells) give interest to the eccentric interiors. The county historical society is the present owner and will maintain the house as a museum of interior decoration.

Boundaries of the district are established for the following reasons:

- 1. With the exception of a few intrusions (noted below) which cannot be omitted, all buildings are visually well-related in scale, texture, material, and style.
- 2. The buildings were all built within about 25 years of each other, and most within ten years.
- Structures immediately outside the district boundaries on north, south, and west are all decidely inferior in architectural quality and of considerably later date. On the east, although some buildings in the next block on Main Street are similar in character, they have quality and greater alteration. Now in the most active part of the business district many of these buildings have acquired "modernized" fronts of incompatible and unattractive materials. Signing is also uncontrolled, creating a logical cut-off point for the district at the corner of Fifth Street.
- The buildings of special interest included in the district are those agreed upon by a survey team from the Community Development Center, school of architecture of the University of Idaho, working with the local historical society. Both the Lewiston Chamber of Commerce and the city council of Lewiston have requested that buildings of historic interest included in the district be limited to the ones enumerated in this descriptive statement.

Intrusions in the district are minimal. They include one ultra-modern "glassbox' bank which is compatible in scale and cornice line, and two brick buildings of later date which are similar in scale to those described. Other lots in the district are open space used for parking. (The bank is labeled A on the attached map, and the brick buildings B).

### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

After mineral discoveries at Pierce, September 30, 1860, the Clearwater gold rush brought thousands of miners into the Nez Perce country the next spring. Lewiston was founded May 19, 1861, as a supply center for the mines at the head of the steamboat navigation. There Idaho territory was organized, July 10, 1863, and Lewiston remained the seat of government until the legislature finally chose a site for permanent capital, effective December 24, 1864. With the end of the gold rush, Lewiston declined for a time, but remained a major regional service community that finally realized the promising future anticipated during the early days of mining excitement.

Few cities in the Pacific Northwest have as large a set of harmonious and compatible structures from one historic era as Lewiston can exhibit on the west end of Main Street. The opportunity to develop this architectural character into a revitalized commercial district with historic flavor is too good to pass up. Preservation and restoration of the Lewiston Historic District is clearly called for and is undoubtedly economically feasible.


