DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Almon Asbury Lieuallen residence is a two-and-one-half story Mansard roofed frame house. The facade is symmetrical with two-story angular bays flanking the centered front entrance. A Mansard roofed porch, added in 1885, runs the length of the facade. Wooden Doric columns support the porch roof which serves as a second story deck. Both the porch and house roofs are bracketed. Slender peaked dormers break the roof's surface.

In 1917 this twelve room house was remodeled into six apartments, making them the first apartments in Moscow with running water and electric ranges. The roof was damaged by fire in recent years but the house remains structurally stable. The only exterior alteration has been the installation of new siding.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Almon Asbury Lieuallen residence is architecturally significant as the only Mansard roofed residence left in Moscow and one of the few surviving houses of this type in Idaho. Almon Asbury Lieuallen brought an important cattle herd to Paradise valley in 1871, at a time when settlement was advancing into the Palouse country. Four years later he started the valley's pioneer store near his homestead which covered the area from Main to Almon Street and from Sixth to A street in later Moscow. In December 26, 1876, the Paradise post office, which had opened nearby in March 19, 1873, moved to Lieuallen's store and its name was changed to Moscow. A year later Lieuallen was made postmaster. After rail service reached there in 1885 (with Henry Villard's Oregon Railway and Navigation Company), followed by the Northern Pacific and the Great Northern, Moscow became the leading commercial center in the rich Palouse country of eastern Washington and northern Idaho.
