DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Woodward Building is a two story, 30' x 90', brick commercial building which is distinguished by its classically inspired iron cornices and white pressed brick facade. The applied ornamentation includes a cavetto between the first and second stories which is supported by modillions at each end and a cornice with four modillions. Rusticated sandstone frames the plate glass windowed first story and the second story windows are framed by brick layed to give a corbelled affect.

Except for a window air conditioner the second story remains unaltered, although the first story has undergone various modifications including the addition of a sign and canopy. However, the alterations mainly involve a change in window treatment, which may be corrected at some future date.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Woodward building is architecturally significant for its ornate metal cornices. The classical ornamentation is unique in Payette and the second story brickwork, which is attributed to Charles Oscar Kirkendall, is of high quality. The building was designed by Tourtellotte and Company, the foremost architectural firm in Idaho at this time, and is the only known building in Payette by them.

Dr. J. C. Woodward, the original owner of the building was very active in municipal affairs and was the prominent doctor in the area. The second floor of this building was his office and residence.
