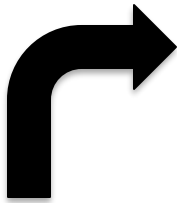




Exhibits Must Include Credits for All Visual Sources

According to the 2021 NHD Contest Rulebook, "All quotes and visual sources (e.g., photographs, paintings, charts, graphs) must be credited on the exhibit and cited in the annotated bibliography (page 31)." Source credits do not count toward the word total. All of these sources should be fully cited in your annotated bibliography as well. Here are some tips for creating credits:

- A credit is much briefer than a full citation. You should include where you accessed the visual source/quote, the year it was made, and the subject or title of the visual source/quote.
- Include the credits in a small font in an inconspicuous location.
- These brief credits do NOT count toward the student-composed word count.



*A brief, factual **credit** is required and does NOT count toward the student-composed 500-word limit.*

*A student-written **caption** does count toward the 500-word limit.*

A caption is not required but is sometimes a good idea to help you show how the image supports your argument.
