

Title 1 School Field Trip Scholarship Application Form

The Idaho State Museum is pleased to offer scholarship funding for eligible Title 1 schools! Thanks to funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Museum provides quality exhibits for students to enjoy in person or virtually. To ensure that as many students can access the Museum as possible, we are offering a limited number of Title 1 scholarships. Funds will be awarded on a first come first serve basis until each month's allotted scholarships are awarded.

Terms and Limitations: This scholarship covers the cost of admission and programming for students and chaperones. Scholarships can be used for onsite visits or virtual field trips. It does not provide funding for transportation or lunch.

Students: Different programs accommodate a various number of students. Please see the Field Trip Information Packet for more information. Schools can submit a separate application to bring additional students on a second day (maximum two applications per grade, per school).

Chaperones: For onsite visits, our minimum requirement is 1 chaperone for every 10 students with a maximum of 1 chaperone for every 5 students. Any additional adults beyond the maximum number of chaperones must pay regular admission prices.

Booking: The scholarship application must be submitted at least 1 month prior to the preferred field trip date. Those receiving the scholarship will be sent an award letter and confirmation information sent via email. If you need to make changes to attendance numbers to accommodate students, chaperones, or teachers please confirm these changes with the education staff at the museum at least **two weeks** prior to your field trip. **All reservations must be cancelled 2 weeks in advance.** Field trips cancelled due to inclement weather will be rescheduled at no additional charge.

Transportation: We offer transportation assistance through the Ray Knight Memorial Scholarship.
